

# MDA sponsors evidencebased dentistry symposium

Friday, October 30, found close to 70 enthusiastic participants gathered on a gray, rainy fall day in St. Paul at the University of Minnesota Continuing Education Center. They heard a program on "Practical Research for Clinical Excellence: Be Better – Be Smarter and Be Part of the Process." Dr. Gary Anderson, Evidence-Based Dentistry (EBD) Taskforce Chair, welcomed the group and gave background on the mission of the Taskforce and activities since its establishment in 2006. He also related how its members, in addition to understanding the value of EBD in their practices, had come to believe that the practicing dental community has an important role to play in the development of credible and clinically useful evidence through practice-based research. This development is in step with comparative effectiveness research being promoted recently at the national level by Congress.

Our first guest presentation was provided by Dr. Julie Frantsve-Hawley from the American Dental Association. Dr. Frantsve-Hawley provided an overview of the many efforts of the ADA to provide background and tools in the use of EBD for its membership, patients and community. The centerpiece of this effort has been the EBD systematic review topical search engine, which has open access. It is clear our Association realizes the value of EBD.

Dr. Jane Gillette, private practitioner from Bozeman, Montana, related how EBD became part of her practice influenced by her dental education at the University of Washington. She enthusiastically described the use of EBD within her

large membership within Minnesota. His presentation with great energy and humor made a case for being involved in both EBD and practice-based research.

In conclusion of the formal program, our own Dr. Pat Foy conducted a roundtable small group session. Dr. Foy, an early skeptic of EBD, has become an enthusiastic

#### Fraud, Waste and Abuse compliance training:

## Delta Dental offers free Medicare-approved course

All Delta Dental participating dentists should have received a letter about a free course designed by Delta to meet the Medicare-required Fraud, Waste and Abuse (FWA) training. All dentists who provide dental services to Medicare Advantage or Medicare Part D members are required to take the FWA training and attest to completion by the entire dental team. You may meet this requirement by taking any Medicare-approved course; however, many courses, including online programs, have a fee. The Delta course is self-explanatory, easy to complete, and offered as a free benefit to all participating dentists.

While the majority of dentists are doing the right thing and providing care with integrity, a small group of active health care fraud perpetrators has resulted in this federal regulation. Fortunately, dentists only need to complete the training once, regardless of how many networks they participate in. You must, however, provide attestation of course completion to all participating networks in order to be eligible to participate in Medicare programs.

## Self-assessment test questions sought

The Board of Dentistry is seeking the assistance of Minnesota dentists in writing questions for the next version of the self-assessment. The self assessment is a required element of the Minnesota Professional Development rules. Specifically, the Board is looking for help drafting questions pertaining to the diagnosis and treatment planning portion of the exam and this is your opportunity to make this requirement meaningful and educational. Once constructed, every dental professional in the state will be required to complete this exam over the following two years.

The time commitment lasts only as long as it takes to finalize the self assessment; however, the Board would welcome anyone who is interested in remaining as part of the task force to begin drafting future exams. There are only a few actual meetings, as most of the work is done on your own, drafting questions and submitting them via email. Once all the questions are gathered, the group meets to discuss the submitted questions and decide which of them will be in the final version.

### FTC extends Red Flags Rule to June 1, 2010

A great victory occurred recently for the dental profession and other small businesses when the Federal Trade Commission extended the Red Flags Rule deadline from November 1, 2009, to June 1, 2010. The Red Flags Rule would require any business that may provide credit to customers to take certain steps to guard against identity theft.

The FTC's agreement to further delay the Rule came as the ADA, fueled by efforts of grassroots dentists, urged final action on legislation to exempt most dental offices. These efforts resulted in the recent successful passage in the U.S. House of Representatives of H.R. 3763, a bill that would exempt small businesses, including private practicing dentists, from having to comply with the Rule. The ADA is seeking similar Senate legislation to assure final congressional passage and enactment of a law excluding Red Flags Rule guidelines for certain businesses, including a health care practice with less than 20 employees. As reported in ADA News recently, a legislative aide to the House sponsor said, "Currently the legislation is pending in the Senate, and we expect the bill will be signed into law shortly."

## DHS seeks candidates for evidencebased oral health care position

The Minnesota Department of Human Services is seeking candidates for an Agency Policy Specialist position in evidence-based oral health care for the Medicaid population. Applications are being accepted until Friday, November 20, 2009.

This new position will have primary responsibility for developing evidence-based coverage policy positions for consideration by the department's Dental Services Advisory Committee (DSAC). The DSAC, composed mostly of dentists and hygienists, is an advisory council that provides oral health recommendations to the department regarding dental benefit coverage for all Minnesota Health Care Programs (MHCP).
